CHILD PASSENGER SAFETY TECHNICIAN

This national standardized course is designed to provide participants with the knowledge and technical skills needed to become certified as Child Passenger Safety Technicians. Topics covered in this college-level class include: basics of injury prevention; federal safety standards; crash dynamics; vehicle occupant protection systems; types of child restraints; selecting and securing children in child restraints; correct installation of child restraints; misuse and compatibility issues; safety in other vehicles; and coordinating a child safety seat check event.

A passing grade of 84% must be achieved on three quizzes (a total of 50 questions), as well as successful completion of three hands-on skills evaluations in order to earn the 2-year national certification. This course is offered in a 4-day and accelerated 3-day format. For the accelerated course, priority seating will be given to law enforcement, public safety, and medical professionals.

Registration for this course must be completed online. Registration fees must be paid to Safe Kids Worldwide prior to class. CEU WORKSHOP FOR CHILD PASSENGER SAFETY TECHNICIANS

This workshop is a technical update designed to assist Georgia's Child Passenger Safety Technicians in earning Continuing Education Units (CEUs) for re-certification. The workshop meets requirements established by the National Child Passenger Safety Board and Safe Kids Worldwide with content designed to improve child passenger safety knowledge through technical updates. Technicians completing the update workshop will receive a certificate of attendance and a copy of the agenda as documentation for re-certification.

This workshop is facilitated by certified CPST Instructors who can verify the five seat installations required for re-certification. Following the workshop, a child safety seat check event is typically held to benefit the local community and provide an opportunity for technicians to meet the community education requirement for re-certification. CPS LAW ENFORCEMENT MANDATE TRAIN-THE-TRAINER

This train-the-trainer workshop is designed for public safety instructors who teach at the state and regional police academies. Participants will receive teaching materials for the newly updated CPS curriculum and instruction from GTIPI CPST Instructors and a POST Instructor/CPST Instructor from a collaborating agency on how to teach CPS to law enforcement trainees.



GEORGIA TEENS RIDE WITH P.R.I.D.E. INSTRUCTOR CERTIFICATION COURSE

This 9-hour train-the-trainer course certifies safety advocates to deliver the University of Georgia's P.R.I.D.E. (Parents Reducing Injuries and Driver Error) curriculum, a free two-hour class designed to help parents and their new teen drivers learn what they need to do during the supervised practice driving time required by law to obtain a Georgia driver's license. This course includes teen driving facts and statistics, crash dynamics, the importance of wearing a seat belt, Georgia's teen driving law, parental influence and peer pressure rather than hands-on driver training. A minimum of two instructors from an area is required to conduct a parent-teen class.

After completing six training hours, new instructors are required to observe an approved 2-hour parent-teen class to complete the certification process. Upon successful completion of the 7-hour training, 2-hour observation and the scheduling of a parent-teen class, course participants receive the instructor manual, videos and all necessary materials to conduct the class for parents and teens in their local communities.



GEORGIA TEENS RIDE WITH P.R.I.D.E. INSTRUCTOR RE-CERTIFICATION

P.R.I.D.E. Instructors must re-certify annually to maintain instructor status. This 3-hour course provides instructors with the latest P.R.I.D.E. curriculum, teen driving laws and the opportunity to network with other instructors from around the state.

 **P.R.I.D.E. MASTER TRAINER**

The P.R.I.D.E. Master Trainer course is an intensive, two-day (16-hour) course offered to experienced P.R.I.D.E. Instructors who exhibit outstanding leadership, presentation skills and a mastery of the curriculum. Master Trainers assist GTIPI staff in training and certifying P.R.I.D.E. Instructors in various regions of the state.

One of the American Automobile Association's (AAA) efforts to keep seniors safe and mobile, CarFit was developed in collaboration with the American Society on Aging (ASA), AARP and the American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA). It is a community-based activity designed to help mature drivers find out how well their cars "fit" and what actions they can take to improve that fit. The program provides an opportunity to open a positive, non-threatening conversation about older driver safety and driver wellness. In addition, CarFit offers specific, practical community resources to help older drivers maintain and strengthen their wellness for ensuring safe, independent driving. WEBCAST
